Main Street Outreach Committee

The Main Street Outreach Committee educates new communities about the Main Street 4-Point Approach® to Revitalization. The committee also educates communities that have abandoned the Main Street Program about the importance of re-establishing the program in their communities.

Outreach - 2013 Successes

- Outreach Luncheon held with Senator Pearce that resulted in contacts being made with Lexington, Richmond, Higginsville and Marshall.
- Contacts made in the following communities by the committee or staff on the Affiliate Grant program: South Grand (St Louis), Lexington, Grandview, Kearney, Odessa, Carrollton, Drexel, Canton, West Bottoms/Stockyard District (Kansas City), University City (St Louis), Fayette, Marceline, Ferguson, Springfield and Del Mar Loop (St Louis).
- Communications calendar was created and utilized throughout the year using Facebook and Email Blasts to share information on MMSC.

- Strategy was started to increase Facebook Likes for the MMSC page. More will follow in 2014.
- Work began on contacting Regional Planning Commissions to make a presentation on Main Street at their respective quarterly meetings or to have a booth at their state conference or make a presentation. Work will continue in 2014.
- Work began on contacting Certified Local Government communities by the committee members. Work will continue in 2014.
- Affiliate Grant Communities accepted in 2013 included: Fayette, Canton and Drexel. The goal for 2014 is 8. Those accepted already include: Marceline, Kearney, Grandview and Lexington. Those expected to apply include: Odessa, Smithville, Albany, Maryville, Poplar Bluff and Ste. Genevieve.
- 25 communities attended Quarterly Training Workshops in 2013 - Total attendance was 84 people at these workshops.
- 41 communities attended an Affiliate Grant Workshop in 2013.

Main Street Financial Resource Development Committee

The Main Street Resource Development Committee establishes financial stability for MMSC so that it will be able to serve Missouri communities for years into the future, with strong partnerships from different areas of financial resources.
